

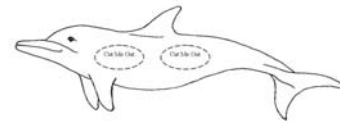
Ocean Commotion Coastal Critter Masks

Bottlenose Dolphin (*Tursiops truncatus*)

The Bottlenose dolphin ...

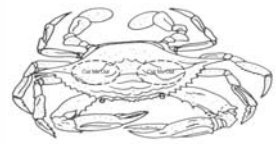
- is the most common and well known dolphin.
- is an air breathing mammal.
- is a small grey cetacean and is related to whales.
- lives near the coast and inshore waters and is common in Louisiana.
- is found from Cape Hatteras to southern Florida and throughout the Gulf of Mexico.
- eats small fish and occasionally squid, crabs and shrimp.
- works as a team to keep fish close together to maximize the harvest.
- has cone-like teeth that are used to grasp food but not to chew it.
- uses sonar to find prey.
- can live up to 25 years.
- is 8-10 ft (2.5-3 m) long.
- weighs 300-650 lb (135-300 kg).
- travels together in pods.
- can dive down to more than 1,000 feet (305 m).
- can jump up to 20 feet (6 m) out of the water.



Blue Crab (*Callinectes sapidus*)

Blue crabs...

- are crustaceans with 10 appendages or legs.
- are related to the shrimp, lobster and crawfish.
- range from Nova Scotia south along the Atlantic coast, throughout the Gulf of Mexico and along the east coast of South America.
- are found in brackish lagoons and estuaries.
- are bottom-dwellers.
- are omnivores. They eat just about anything!
- can grow up to 9 inches wide.
- live for 1 to 3 years.
- weigh up to 2 pounds.
- walk sideways.
- have sapphire-tinted claws.
- combined harvest in 2006 was about 52 million lbs (24 million kg) worth \$32 million.



American Alligator (*Alligator mississippiensis*)



The American Alligator...

- is a reptile with tough, heavy skin and is related to crocodiles.
- builds nests and lay eggs.
- is native to the United States and China and is found in coastal states from North Carolina to Texas and Oklahoma and Arkansas.
- lives primarily in freshwater environments such as ponds, marshes, rivers and swamps.
- is an opportunistic feeder and eats almost anything it can catch.
- young eat fish, insects, snails and crustaceans.
- adults eat fish, turtles, mammals, birds and other reptiles.
- has a transparent third eyelid that gives underwater protection.
- has 80 conical teeth that are used for grabbing and holding, not for cutting.
- can use 2,000-3,000 teeth in a lifetime.
- average size is 8.2 ft (2.5 m) and average weight is 800 lbs (363 kg).
- maximum recorded length is 19 ft 2 in (5.8 m).
- was first harvested in Louisiana in the early 1800's for its skin and for its oil.
- hide, meat and eggs harvested in Louisiana has generated over \$20 million each year.
- adult can survive freezing conditions if it is in water.
- conservation program began in the 1970s after the population declined due to poaching.

Spotted Sea Trout, Speckled Trout (*Cynoscion nebulosus*)

The Spotted sea trout or speckled trout...

- is a common estuarine fish.
- is a voracious predator.
- eats shrimp, crabs and fish.
- is a member of the drum family, not the trout family.
- can live to about 8-10 years.
- average length for a male is 19 in (28 cm) and 25 in (64cm) for a female).
- weighs from 1-2 lbs (0.5 to 1 kg).
- travels in small schools.
- is a recreational fish in Louisiana.
- has two prominent canine teeth.
- males produce a "drumming" sound to attract females.
